Structure and Overview

The Confessional Community Clinical Training Program™ develops and equips new and prospective Confessional Community™ leaders to establish and successfully lead Confessional Communities™ in their contexts. The unique and multi-faceted approach of the Program forms leaders who cultivate emotional, relational, and spiritual growth in the members of their Confessional Communities™ and spark the transformation of families, churches, workplaces, and communities.

The Program weaves together foundational elements of Christian spiritual formation and a contemporary understanding of the work of psychotherapy. It is clinical in focus and draws from the theoretical and practical foundations of interpersonal neurobiology (IPNB), process group psychotherapy, psychodynamic theory, attachment theory, experiential modalities, and other related orientations.

The Program is primarily designed for mental health clinicians who aspire to lead therapy groups in professional or community settings. Non-clinicians (clergy, teachers, business leaders, community leaders, ministry leaders, etc.) who have extensive experience providing care in a group setting may also be considered. All prospective participants must apply to the Program and receive formal acceptance before attending.

The primary leaders and trainers are Curt Thompson, MD and Courtney Morrison, LCSW. Additional leaders are licensed mental health clinicians who themselves have been trained to

lead Confessional Communities™. The Program is hosted by New Story Behavioral Health, an outpatient mental health practice in the Washington, DC Metro Area.



Training Schedule

Opening Event

November 13-15, 2024

A Confessional Community Intensive with teaching components. Held in-person in Falls Church, VA and led by Curt Thompson, MD, Courtney Morrison, LCSW, and trained staff.

Remote Confessional Community™ Sessions 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month, 12:00-1:30, December 3, 2024 – September 2, 2025

One-and-a-half-hour organic Confessional Community sessions with the groups formed at the Opening Event. Conducted over Zoom and led by the Opening Event group leaders.

Remote Teaching Sessions on Core Issues 2nd Tuesday of every month, 12:00-1:00, December 10, 2024 – September 2, 2025

One-hour, structured teaching on core issues related to leading Confessional Communities. Conducted over Zoom and led by Curt Thompson, MD, Courtney Morrison, LCSW, and New Story staff.

Closing Event

September 10-12, 2025

A Confessional Community Intensive with live practice, consultation, and demonstration. Also including teaching sessions on core issues. Held in-person in Falls Church, VA and led by Curt Thompson, MD, Courtney Morrison, LCSW, and trained staff.

Clinicians and Non-clinicians: The first cohort of The Training Program will be geared towards clinicians though we encourage anyone who is interested to apply.


